Primary Swimming Program

The Primary Intensive Swimming Program commenced last week and will continue until the end of this week. All Primary students will participate in the intensive NSW Royal Lifesaving Society's *Swim and Survive* Program. It is important for all students to acquire competent water safety and swimming skills and this is a great opportunity to participate in an excellent program provided by Balranald Central School and their staff at no more than the cost of pool entry fee of \$1 per day. We expect all primary students to participate in this program. The lessons will take place from 12.00 pm to 2.40 pm daily, with a session for each primary class. Sessions will be taught by primary AUSWIM accredited staff members Mrs Alison Linnett, Mrs Kate Harper and Mrs Laurel Stevens, with Mrs Stevens overseeing the program in her capacity as a NSW Royal Lifesaving Society Instructor and Examiner.

Maitland Grossmann School Visit



Bell Shakespeare

Balranald Central School, St Joseph's and Clare Public School students have spent the past two weeks exploring the wonderful world of Shakespeare with presenters Huw and Suzanne from the Bell Shakespeare company.

Primary students focussed on A Midsummer Night's Dream and Year 8 worked with the Bard's classic play Romeo and Juliet as a way of introducing them to Shakespeare's work and language.

Year 9 will be looking at *Julius Caesar* as part of their English studies next year and the workshops provided them with a brilliant introduction to the text and helped them to better understand the story and the often perplexing language that Shakespeare uses in his plays.

The Year 10 students immersed themselves in *Macbeth* and performed a brilliant moved synopsis in order to cement their knowledge of the challenging text. The group offered fantastic insights when working on characterisation and were particularly enthusiastic about the stage fighting techniques they learnt.

Senior classes were introduced to stagecraft and Huw and Suzanne were kind enough to divert from their Shakespearean program to offer this group some insight into *The Crucible*, which they will study in the course of their HSC.

The Bell Shakespeare experience is one that would generally be quite a costly endeavour; we were, however, lucky enough to be offered this opportunity for free as part of a research project run by Education Transformations in conjunction with Bell Shakespeare.

Why is it so important that children drink water?

How much water does my child need?

The recommended daily amounts of fluid for children and adolescents are:

- 5 glasses (1 litre) for 5 8 year olds

AQUA-FIT EXERCISE CLASSES

\$2 pool entry fee per session. Season pass holders are no charge. Sessions are designed to cater for adults and older teens. No primary school age children.

Classes will NOT BE HELD when the air temperature at the Pool is below 28°C at 3pm, the water temperature is below 24°C, or the wind/breeze is cool/cold across the water (especially a southerly). Each, or a combination of all these factors is taken into account at 3pm on the date of the proposed class.

The Pool telephone service 5020 1357 is updated to inform whether the session will proceed.

Dates definitely not available at this stage are December 11th, 13th and 25th, January 10th and February 14th.
