Maths in Trades

Students were judged in three areas.

- 1. Employability skills: These were Teamwork, Problem Solving, Planning and Organising and Communication. Mrs Annette Gorham from the DEC VET Directorate spent the day observing students as they tackled the many challenges and problems thrown at them. Needless to say she was impressed with the way in which all teams worked together.
- 2. Math problems: There were four problems in this competition. The first was a group problem where teams were handed the plans and had to work out the area and perimeter of the job they were to complete. IMC Industrial blew the competition by solving the group problem very quickly and was able to progress onto the next challenge before the rest. There were three other individual problems where one by one each team

member was locked in a room to complete their problem. They were removed from their other team members for 15 minutes. Mr Bevan oversaw these activities. This was the area of the competition that would have the biggest impact

on the final result.

3. Fabrication skills: This involved teams fabricating a dust pan. This section was judged by Sunraysia TAFE teachers Jack Barry and Chris Gaston. Both teachers were impressed with quality of the product produced by all teams, particularly since most team members have only had less than 30 hours of instruction in metal fabrication over the course of the year.



It was an amazing event to watch unfold. The level of teamwork and focus demonstrated by all competitors was intense throughout the day. All teams worked and encouraged each other as a level of productive hum was evident around the arena throughout the day.

The Maths in Trades Olympiad was a fitting end to the 2013 Maths in Trades program. The Olympiad was an idea that I had and I would like to thank Sunraysia TAFE for enthusiastically coming on board to make an idea a reality. In particular Mr Devon Andrews for embracing the Maths in Trades program and the Olympiad. The format was something that we made up and a competition like this is currently not available in any other schools. Balranald Central School is extremely lucky to have a fantastic partnership with Sunraysia TAFE. A thank you to Mr Riesinger for not only allowing us to offer such a valuable program, but allowing me to purchase such fantastic prizes for the Olympiad winners.

Finally, congratulations to **JAB Welding and Contruction**, made up of Bailey Brougham, Jamie Simpson and Aaron Gervasi who took out **GOLD** on the day. Five points behind for **SILVER** was the **Three Metal Birds**, made up of Gabi Ryan, Shania Bax and Chelsie Scott. The following students are high achievers in the areas of Mathematics and Science. This program is an enrichment experience for three students from Balranald Central and St Joseph's schools.




