Year 5/6 Excursion to Yanga

Ms Aliwarga, Mrs Linnett and Year 5/6 visited Yanga Homestead at Yanga National Park on Thursday, 5 December 2013. The excursion incorporated parts of their unit in 'Food for the Tucker Box'. The tour started in the Cook's Cottage where Ranger Mon (Mrs Simone Carmichael) explained the history of Yanga and some artefacts that were displayed. Students also had the opportunity to have a hands-on experience with various bush tuckers, artefacts and resource plants. Then we were shown the Homestead and we walked down to the Lookout where we saw Yanga Lake and Pelican Point. We continued walking along the shore until we came to a Shell Midden. Shell Middens are the remains of camps where freshwater mussels are eaten and discarded. Close by, we saw a Ring Tree created by tying 2 branches together to form a ring which is significant to the indigenous people.
