Principal's Perspectives

Welcome to all parents to week 10 of term four.

On Thursday the 4th of December Balranald Central School had a visit from the Honourable Adrian Piccoli the New South Wales Education Minister. Mr Piccoli had a tour of the school and spent time with myself and other senior staff discussing topics such as school finance, student programs and staffing. It was a pleasure to host Mr Piccoli who spent the time to appreciate the positive aspects of BCS while listening to some of our concerns.

I attended the Central School's Principal conference in Sydney on the 27th and 28th of November. The opportunity has given our school a snapshot of many other Central Schools across the state. The conference covered topics and areas such as senior curriculum, middle schooling, early intervention, school planning, K-12 management, Resource allocation and various sharing sessions. It was without a doubt a very worthwhile event.

Congratulations to all students who participated in the Maths in Trades Olympiad. The day was real test for students which developed determination, skills and confidence. A special thank you to Stobon Lloyd who has driven the program. The support and assistance of Devon Andrews from Sunraysia TAFE has been outstanding. The students are already looking forward to the program next year.

The Intensive Swimming Program for our Primary students has started. It is pleasing to see our school utilising community facilities. Again it is great to see students challenging themselves and developing their water skills. The importance of programs that go beyond our curriculum cannot be understated as they develop genuine lifelong skills.

On Saturday, 22nd November I saw my first Balranald Central School Year 12 Formal at the Theatre Royal. It was a fantastic night for our newly departed students, their families and friends. Our school has been accessing the circus skills program during the regular day as well as a series of after school workshops. This program is capturing the skills of our motivated students. The Year 3/4 class went on an overnight excursion to Bendigo on the 25th and 26th of November. Two weeks ago, the premier, Mike Baird, and the Minister for Education, Adrian Piccoli, announced the next stage of the school Resource Allocation Model (RAM). The RAM is a more equitable, efficient and transparent funding model that underpins our reforms to devolve more decision - making to principals and communities. Schools receive funding and equity loadings based on socio-economic backgrounds, Aboriginal students, remote/isolation and English language proficiency. The new model will allow Balranald Central School to build on the increased decision-making authority to respond to local needs to improve our students' learning outcomes.

PARENTS AND CARERS THESE HOLIDAYS

As the school holidays approach, it is important to remember when walking near roads, on footpaths, near driveways and in car parks always:

 hold your child's hand. Until they are at least 8 years old children need to hold an adult's hand. Until they at least



10, children should be closely supervised by an adult and hold hands when crossing the road.

- talk to your child about road safety. Talk about how to be safe when near roads. Be a good role model.
- point out road safety dangers and differences in new environments. This is especially important when on holidays in different surroundings. Roads, footpaths and pedestrian may look different in holiday areas.

The best way to keep your child safe on or near the road is to hold their hand.

Talk with your child daily about road safety.

Remind other adults and carers about this too.

Samantha will be completing a certificate III in Allied Health Assistance and Tearra will be doing a Certificate III in Health Services Assistance as part of their HSC over the next two years. Both Girls will be working with our local health service in Balranald to complete the on-the-job component of their traineeship.

Balranald Central School is excited to be working in partnership with Far West Health and our local health care workers on this great initiative.

Far West Local Health District School Based Apprenticeships And Traineeships Program Launch

The Far West Local Health District's School Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships (SBATs) program was today officially launched by the Hon. Melinda Pavey, Parliamentary Secretary for Regional and Rural Health, on behalf of the Minister for Health, the Hon. Jillian Skinner.

SBATs are a Department of Education and Communities initiative providing Year 11 and 12 students with the opportunity to gain an industry recognised qualification and employment as part of their HSC.

"This is the first time the Far West Local Health District has offered School Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships as an established program", Ms Rebecca Heron-Dowling, Far West LHD Management Trainee said.

"The Program provides students with an exceptional opportunity to gain entry into the workforce and an industry recognised qualification while they are studying at school.

"We are also very grateful for the Parliamentary Secretary for Regional and Rural Health, Melinda Pavey, to travel to Broken Hill to launch the scheme, on behalf of the Minister."

Ms Heron-Dowling said the scope and depth of the program is a precedent for NSW Health and provides employment opportunities and development of skills of young people in our communities. "It will create pathways for young people wanting to go to university and or pursue careers within the health sector and builds the future workforce of the Far West LHD and service capacity."

Students from Balranald Central School, Broken Hill High School, Coomealla High School, Wilcannia Central School and Willyama High School will be appointed to traineeships in Business Administration (medical), Health Services Assistance and Allied Health Assistance.




