It was also pleasing to see many of our student volunteer to unload in the morning and reload the wheelchair van in the afternoon.

The purpose of the meeting was to start mapping out a positive direction for Stage 6 success at BCS by incorporating parent involvement and strengthening a partnership and a shared responsibility for student success. FUNDRAISER TO PUBLISH A BOOK TO HELP CHILDREN IDENTIFY FEELINGS AND UNDERSTAND A SMALL PART OF THE GRIEF PROCESS.



The beginning of this year the unimaginable happened to my niece, she lost her husband and two children (Koda, aged 4 years and Hunter, 9 months), her whole family, her world!! You can imagine her feeling of quietness and emptiness where her life was once filled.

After this tragedy my niece (her name is Melissa), went back to work part time. Mel is an Early Childhood teacher and became aware from comments made by the children that this event had impacted their little lives as well.

Melissa said, "I realise that what happened does not only impact me, it impacts those around me, my immediate family, my extended family, friends and the wider community."

Mel decided that she would like to write a book for Koda's little friends.

She is currently writing a children's book that a South Australian Publisher has agreed to publish. The book includes very personal memories but is also generalised enough that any child that has experienced the loss of a family member or friend will be able to put themselves into the story. Mel would love to see every school have one of these books.

The purpose of the book aims to help children identify feelings, understand a small part of the grief process and most importantly to promote discussion about losing a loved one.

To make this book a reality Mel will be walking the Kokoda track again in 2017 to raise the funds to publish her book. A fundraising account has now been set up for public donations and there will also be local fundraising events held in Port Lincoln in the near future to further aid her cause.

To help Mel to achieve this next goal Balranald Central School will be holding a 'No Uniform Day' on Thursday, November 17th, but ask that students wear something <u>BLUE</u>!! Koda, Mel's eldest son's favourite colour was blue and it would be a wonderful tribute for students to wear blue. We ask that all students make a <u>gold coin donation</u> for being *out of uniform* which will be donated to this very worthwhile cause. Our new School Captains will be cooking a sausage sizzle on this day for \$1 and selling cans of soft drink for \$2.


