Here are the top 14 reasons why Homework is important:

- 1. It improves your child's thinking and memory
- 2. It helps your child develop positive study skills and habits that will serve him or her well throughout life
- 3. Homework encourages your child to use time wisely
- 4. It teaches your child to work independently
- 5. Homework teaches your child to take responsibility for his or her work
- 6. It allows your child to review and practice what has been covered in class
- 7. It helps your child to get ready for the next day's class
- 8. Homework helps your child learn to use resources, such as libraries, reference materials, and computer Web sites to find information
- 9. It encourages your child to explores subjects more fully than classroom time permits
- 10. It allows your child to extend learning by applying skills to new situations

Home Readers

As the year begins to draw to a close we are trying to get back all our **Home Readers**. These readers are a very important part of our Guided Reading Program that takes place in every classroom on most days. Students read between 1-4 readers a week depending on their year level. That averages out to be between 40-160 books per year per students, that students are able to take home. These books cost on average \$10 each. If your child is in Kindergarten they borrow on average \$1600 worth of readers per student each year. My point is it is **very important that these readers come back to the school so they can be used over and over again.**

If you have a pile of readers sitting at home or hiding under beds could you please bring them back! They can be dropped off at the Front Office or to the Classroom Teacher. They are very expensive to replace.
