#### **High Achievement in ICAS Spelling Competition**

Congratulations to Chase Riedy (Year 3) who scored the highest mark in the ICAS University of New South Wales spelling competition for his age group. A special ceremony will be held on Wednesday 27th where recipients receive a medal for excellent performance. Last week I picked up an old surfboat from Wollongong. The boat was donated by the Austinmer Surf Club and will be rowed on the local waterways by students, staff and the general school community. Bulli Surf Club have also donated a boat, which will be picked up by the end of the year. It is an opportunity for students to get fit, have fun, try something different and participate in some community fundraising. The boats will be assigned to each sporting house and will be integral to our interhouse competition in 2020. There is also an opportunity for interested students to complete the annual Murray River Rowathon which is 90km marathon held on the Murray river to raise funds for the Royal Flying Doctors Service. The school is also acquiring 2 rowing machines so that fitness training and technique can be completed on dry land in preparation for the water. I would like to thank Shane Gerloven, Chris Mercer and Keith Caldwell from the Bulli Surf Life Saving Club and Ian Foreman & Stephen Perkiss from Austinmer Surf Life Saving Club for assisting with the project. The boats have not been in use for some time but both have won Australian Gold Medals in the surfboat events at the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships. The Austinmer boat won Gold in the Open Surf Boat in 2003 at Kurrawa Qld and the Bulli boat won Gold in the Reserve Surf Boat in 2009 at Scarborough Beach, WA. There are a few further wainwright jobs to complete such as fitting rolling seats and painting the boat and oars before rowing commences on the water. I would also like to thank Ian Backhouse from Thirroul who has been integral in liaising with both surf clubs, BCS and local tradesmen in order to bring the project to fruition. Lastly, I would like to thank and acknowledge Peter Christian who has been instrumental in coordinating payments, ordering supplies and getting the boat trailers ready for registration. He is a dead set champion! Hopefully these decorated Aussie surfboats will continue to provide opportunities for students in our isolated community. I look forward to continuing the relationship with Bulli and Austinmer Surf Clubs into the future bringing the bush to the beach and beach to the bush.




