
Year 8 Science

Students have been busy in the lab these past couple of weeks completing hands on investigations into the various methods used to separate mixtures. Students will have a **practical assessment** on **Monday 9th November** where they will be required to design and perform a first-hand investigation as well as analyse their results. **Year 8 Science End of Year Examination** will be held **Monday Week 6.** Assessment notifications have gone out for both of these assessments.

Today they will complete their **VALID 8 examination**, a compulsory state-wide test similar to NAPLAN, where their knowledge of scientific content and skills are assessed and compared to other students across NSW. The results of this test will be used to inform our teaching practice for individual students next year. Parents will also receive a copy of these results by the end of the year.

Year 9/10 Science

Last Wednesday, Year 9/10 Science students participated in a Zoom meeting workshop with La Trobe University Science Lecturers. They were given a brief of a crime and were required to perform several chemical analysis tests on a variety of white powders and identify who committed the crime. This opportunity compliments our current unit of Chemical Reactions. Our students are to be commended for their mature behaviour and diligence during this workshop, with a standout performance by Blair Manning. Over the next two weeks, students will be looking at acid/base reactions and their uses in everyday lives as well metal displacement reactions. Year 9/10 students will be completing a **practical assessment** in class next **Tuesday 10th November**, where their ability to perform first-hand investigations accurately and analyse data using their scientific knowledge will be assessed. Their **End of Year Examination** will be held on **Monday Week 6**. Assessment notifications have gone out for both of these assessments.



Year 12 Chemistry

We are currently looking at quantitative data for equilibrium reactions. This involves lots of calculations and practicals. We will be working on our **depth study assessment task** over the coming weeks.

Year 5/6 Science

Year 5/6 have begun **coming to the lab every Tuesday for a lesson in Science**. This is part of a transition program for our Year 6 students. Year 5/6 are currently looking at states of matter and chemical reactions for certain mixtures. So far, we have identified physical properties of each state of matter and looked at examples. Last week, students performed a first-hand investigation looking at the solubility of different substances in oil and water.

From Week 4 to Week 9, Year 6 students from St Joseph's Primary School will be attending our Tuesday lessons. During these weeks we will be focusing on scientific skills such as becoming familiar with lab equipment, performing first-hand investigations accurately, collecting and communicating data and analysing data.

Definitely food for thought?


