Year 11 final examinations are fast approaching on the 15th September and hopefully they have already started preparing for these assessments. I encourage all parents and carers to assist their children by:


- 1. Ensuring they are getting enough sleep.

Year 5/6 ran speed dating with a book. Students listened to 8 different books. Year 5/6 did a great job reading.




Softball

VALID Science test-Year 6

Last Tuesday Year 6 students sat the VALID test.

VALID Science 6 contains multiple choice, short response and extended response tasks that are grouped around real-world issues, including scientific investigations.

This is a diagnostic test, with tasks framed on Stage 3 outcomes and essential content in the NSW Science Years K—10 Syllabus.

Students are tested on their:

- knowledge and understanding of science
- understanding and skills in the process of scientific investigation
- ability to evaluate evidence, make judgements and think critically
- ability to access information and communicate scientific ideas. Students also complete a survey about their opinions, attitudes, and values about science.

Working Bee in the Garden


