

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# Remembrance Day







### PRINCIPAL'S PONDERINGS

Care is such a great value to have in a school. Empathy and caring are very close relatives, with empathy being the capacity to understand another person's point of view or their experience whereas caring is the actual act of someone who cares. When I look around the school, we have many people at many levels who have empathy and care for others. Staff, students and parents/carers demonstrate empathy and care to others on a daily basis. It has many benefits such as a heightened sense of wellbeing, creating a sense of belonging and purpose, and promotes positivity. The BCS school community showed that we cared when we stopped to reflect and remember our service men and women on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month - Remembrance Day. This day commemorates the signing of the peace agreement that ended World War One but now is extended to remember those who have given their lives in service to their country in wars and conflicts around the world. We also remember those who have come home injured or ill, in body or spirit and to remember those who bravely serve our country today. Thank you to the entire BCS community who stopped for a moment and remembered last Friday.

The Department of Education also cares about the current mosquito problem that we are experiencing. The school grounds and buildings have been sprayed in order to disrupt the life cycle and the DOE is supplying heaps of repellent for students and staff in the coming days.

The floodwater around at the moment has made preparations for excursions quite precarious. Access to some parts of the country is difficult and excursion organisers are keeping abreast on Emergency Service and Police information in order to ensure a smooth running of any excursion with the first aim being to keep the kids safe. Apologies in advance to parents and carers for any changes that occur, and I appreciate your flexibility.

Some staff are currently undergoing training in Mental Health First Aid. This training is conducted by our own Deniliquin Wellbeing team over 4 days in the coming weeks - my thanks to Michelle White and Lyn Bond and to Mr White for coordinating the training. 1 in 5 Australians will experience a mental health problem in any given year. That means that every person is likely to know someone who is experiencing a mental health problem, whether that is a family member, a friend or colleague. In fact, mental illness is now said to affect every Australian either directly or indirectly. We need to have more support skills in our BCS community to help catch those students experiencing mental health problems and troubled times. This course will equip our staff with the knowledge and confidence to recognise, connect and respond to someone experiencing a mental health problem or mental health crisis.

Kindergarten transition is nearing completion and from all reports it has been a very successful program. My thanks to Mrs Calleja, Mrs Lockhart and Sue Murphy for coordinating these activities for our future Kindies. At BCS we view transition as a two-way experience, both an opportunity to build relationships with children, families and community as well as an opportunity to orient children to the school context. This program offers children and families multiple opportunities to feel a sense of belonging to the BCS community. This has been achieved over a period of 6 weeks and draws on a range of transition practices including getting to know the school, getting to know each other, a school tour, numeracy & literacy activities and game-based learning.

The 3/4 excursion to Altina Wildlife Park was a fun day. Students rode in horse-drawn or motorised wagons as they observed wild animals at their feeding times.


A highlight was watching the powerful and beautiful African white lioness rise to her full height to feed - fortunately on chicken scraps rather than BCS kids!








## Remembrance Day by Year 5/6

Come dressed in your best Aussie gear or Khaki and look like one of the Irwins




