Fruit Break


Please ensure your child brings fruit each day for Fruit Break. The fruit needs to be easy for your child to eat, e.g., an orange cut into pieces.

Charles Darwin by Sienna Comitti

Charles Darwin was a native of England who started his education at Shrewsbury Primary School. He studied medicine at the University of Edinburgh and priesthood at Cambridge University.

Charles was always interested in collecting insects from the garden when he was a child. He was unhappy in the priesthood but still enjoyed botany and entomology. John Henslow, a botany professor, invited Charles Darwin to travel on his ship, on an expedition around the world.

Before going on the expedition Charles had to ask his father. At first, he said no but seeing how keen his son was, he said yes. For the next five years they were going to be studying plants and insects. During this time the crew went to Brazil, Argentina, Chile, Peru and the Galapagos Islands.

The Galapagos Islands were one of the places Charles and John visited. Charles was interested in the birds. He realised that each bird on each island had a different beak. Some beaks were small while others were big. Darwin sketched these birds and their beaks. This led Darwin to write a book when he returned to England.

The Beagle returned to England, in October 1836. Over the next 20 years Charles wrote his book, 'On the Origin of the Species by Means of Natural Selection', which set out his theories on evolution about people and animals. His research had people shocked, not many believed Darwin, they all believed in God creating the world.

Today, Charles Darwin's theory has changed the way people think about evolution. Most scientist have accepted the Darwinian theory. Over his lifetime he has ridden a giant tortoise, written and published a successful book, visited the Galapagos Islands, sailed on the HMS Beagle, and met Professor John Henslow. He was a great science and etymologist. I hope we get more people like him in the future.


When Darwin was invited to go on the Beagle, he asked his father if he could go. His father was not happy that Charles wanted to go, but seeing that Charles really wanted to go, he let him. The Beagle left in 1831. Charles would be gone for 5 years. He visited Brazil, Argentine, Chile and Peru.


The Galapagos Islands are 10 rocky islands off the coast of Ecuador. The wildlife on each island was very different in many ways. Charles found four types of finches with different beaks. The different beaks allowed them to eat different seeds. Lots of the animals were castaways from the mainland, like the iguana and a little friend of theirs, a little lizard that eats all the flies off the iguanas back.


On Charles return to England on the HMS Beagle in October 1836, he studied the animals and plants he found during his 5-year voyage. For the next 20 years Charles wrote about his findings and published a book called 'On the Origin of the Species'.


Charles was a very prominent scientist in the 1800's who travelled the world collecting samples of animals, plants and fossils. Darwin discovered the theory of evolution and natural selection.

YEAR 5-6 DRAWING OF IGUANAS




















BCS Sports Report by Mr Marsh
